The Human Condition

"In this world we are influenced by two sentiments, Joy and Pain.

One of the revered Baha'i teachers in the early part of the 20th century related God as the Sun and the Manifestations as Perfect Mirrors reflecting the light to us in a way that is more understandable and comparable to our own experience..

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"It is clear... that the essential reality of God is revealed in His perfections; and the sun, with its perfections, reflected in a mirror, is a visible thing, an entity clearly expressing the bounty of God."

"God is as the Sun; our souls are created to mirror forth the Godly beauty. However imperfect, our work in acquiring more of the virtues or Godly attributes is the cleansing of "the spotting of self" from the mirror of the heart.
